Message from Principal, Heidi Galassi:

Hello Graham Families!

We hope this message finds you well and filled with anticipation for the new academic year. As we gear up for another exciting journey of learning and growth, we wanted to extend a heartfelt welcome to you and your children. The first day of school is Wednesday, August 9th. We are eagerly preparing to open our doors and create an engaging, supportive, and enriching environment for all our middle school students.

At Graham Middle School, we believe that education is a collaborative effort that involves the whole triangle of support: staff, students, and the parents. We value your partnership and look forward to working together to ensure the success and well-being of your child throughout their middle school years. Our dedicated team of educators has been working diligently to create a curriculum that fosters critical thinking, creativity, and a love for learning. We are committed to providing a safe and inclusive space where your child can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally.

As we approach the first day of school, we encourage you to take some time to discuss your child's goals and aspirations for the upcoming year. Encourage open communication and be sure to reach out to us with any questions or concerns you may have. Together, we can make this school year a remarkable and transformative experience for your child.

First iReady Assessments for the Year

All our students will be engaging in the first iReady assessments for the school year. They will take place next week on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, August 14-17th. The assessment will be completed after the 13-minute break and before lunch. The first assessment completed will be Math and then Reading.

Please remind your child of the following:

- The assessment is adaptive and therefore it is impossible to know the answers to all questions you will be given.
- Pace yourself throughout the assessment. Do not perseverate or take too much time on any one question. Do not rush through the assessment.
- Take a short break, if needed, during the assessment. You can take a few deep breaths or rest your eyes away from the screen.
- Do your best and show us what you know so we know how best to support you this year in the classroom.

The criteria below will be used for math placements:

- For placement in the 6.2 pathway, students will need a score of 527 or higher on the i-Ready diagnostic
- Students that were in the 6.1 pathway for 2022-23 school year will move into either math 7 or math 7.1 or math 7.2.
 - For placement in the 7.1 pathway, students will need a score of 508 or higher on the i-Ready diagnostic
 - For placement in the 7.2 pathway, students will need a score of 541 or higher on the i-Ready diagnostic
- Students that were in the 6.2 pathway will move onto Math 7.2.
- For placement in the 8.1 pathway, students will need a score of 518 or higher on the i-Ready diagnostic

Our primary goal is to ensure that your student is placed in the math class that is right for him/her.

Math Placement Appeal Process

Our middle schools take very careful consideration when placing students into math courses so that students can be successful and confident in their coursework. Student placement is determined objectively by i-Ready assessments with secondary data points of CAASPP scores. Changes in placement for students who did not meet the criteria for advanced math pathways (.1 and .2) are unlikely. However, the Mountain View Whisman School District does have a new placement appeal process. Please go to https://www.mvwsd.org/academics/teaching_the_standards/math to learn more about the process. The deadline for submitting Appeal Forms is 4pm, August 28th.

Medication Forms

Drop-off and Pick-up

There are different options for arriving at school. Please check out the Graham website for ideas for Walking and Biking to School. If you plan to drop off your student on campus, please use the parking lot in front of the library for drop off and pick up. Please pull all the way up and then let your students out. Please do not pull out of the line. This is to assure that everyone safely exits their vehicle. The MVSP

(Gym) parking lot will be for staff only. Also, Lane Avenue may not be used as a drop off or pick up location for students. Due to the limited space, it causes a safety hazard for our students.

Bike Cage

Please remind your students to lock their bikes in the bike cage. While the bike cage protects student bikes from theft by individuals passing our campus during the day, it does not guarantee theft protection after school from persons entering the bike cage. Locking their bike is the best way to ensure that the only person who walks away with a bike from our bike cage is the bike's owner.
