Message from Principal, Heidi Galassi:

Hello Graham Families!

In the tumultuous landscape of middle school, where social dynamics can be intricate and emotions run high, addressing mean comments or gossip becomes an inevitable part of a child's experience. Navigating through such situations requires both resilience and guidance, and parents play a crucial role in helping their children develop the emotional tools needed to respond effectively.

- 1. Stay Calm: Encourage your child to stay calm and composed when they hear mean comments. Reacting impulsively might escalate the situation.
- 2. Take a Deep Breath: Teach your child the importance of taking deep breaths when they feel upset. This simple technique can help them regulate their emotions and think more clearly.
- 3. Assess the Situation: Guide your child to assess the situation before responding. Ask them to consider whether the comment is worth reacting to or if it's better to let it go.
- 4. Talk to the Friend: If a friend informs them about mean comments, encourage your child to discuss how they feel after being informed and whether or not they would like to be informed in the future.
- 5. Encourage Reporting: If the mean comments persist or escalate, advise your child to report the incident to a teacher, school counselor, or another trusted adult so they can help.
- 6. Build Resilience: Help your child develop resilience by reminding them that not everyone's opinion matters. Reinforce their self-worth and encourage them to focus on positive aspects of themselves.
- 7. Promote Healthy Friendships: Talk to your child about surrounding themselves with positive and supportive friends. Encourage them to prioritize friendships that uplift and encourage one another.
- 8. Model Positive Behavior: Demonstrate positive behavior in your own interactions. Children often learn from observing their parents, so modeling how to handle difficult situations can be powerful.

Remember to approach these discussions with empathy and understanding. Middle school can be a challenging time, and your support can make a significant difference in how your child navigates social situations.

Reporting an Absence

Medication Forms

If your child requires medication to be kept at school, please pick up a <u>medication release form</u> from the school office. We cannot administer any medication without the forms. Drop-off and Pick-up

There are different options for arriving at school. Please check out the Graham website for ideas for Walking and Biking to School. If you plan to drop off your student on campus, please use the parking lot in front of the library for drop off and pick up. Please pull all the way up and then let your students out. Please do not pull out of the line. This is to assure that everyone safely exits their vehicle. The MVSP (Gym) parking lot will be for staff only. Also, Lane Avenue may not be used as a drop off or pick up location for students. Due to the limited space, it causes a safety hazard for our students.

Bike Cage

Please remind your students to lock their bikes in the bike cage. While the bike cage protects student bikes from theft by individuals passing our campus during the day, it does not guarantee theft protection after school from persons entering the bike cage. Locking their bike is the best way to ensure that the only person who walks away with a bike from our bike cage is the bike's owner.
