As we get closer to the state testing, students may start to feel pressure to prepare for such a big exam. These tests can bring anxiety to students who may not feel ready or think they are good at taking tests. Some ways to support students at home between now and a few more weeks include:

- 1. Practice Tests: Provide students with opportunities at home to take practice tests. This helps them become comfortable with the test structure.
- 2. Test-Taking Strategies: Teach students strategies for approaching different types of test questions, such as multiple choices. This includes techniques for managing time effectively and eliminating incorrect answers.
- 3. Stress Management: Help students develop strategies for managing test anxiety and stress. This could include relaxation techniques, mindfulness exercises, or positive self-talk.

Please do not pull out of the line. This is to assure that everyone safely exits their vehicle. The MVSP (Gym) parking lot will be for staff only. Also, Lane Avenue may not be used as a drop off or pick up location for students. Due to the limited space, it causes a safety hazard for our students.

Bike Cage

Please remind your students to lock their bikes in the bike cage. While the bike cage protects student bikes from theft by individuals passing our campus during the day, it does not guarantee theft protection after school from persons entering the bike cage. Locking their bike is the best way to ensure that the only person who walks away with a bike from our bike cage is the bike's owner.
